**William Brannon**, for 496 days duty as a horseman from 15 Sept. 1779 to 1 July 1781 in Captain Parson's and Hambleton's Companies of Col. Roebucks Regiment. Charged L496; deduct less the last tour being foot duty in Md.; of horse (one half) - 85.10; currency L410.10; Sterling L58.12.10; 58 pounds 12 shillings and ten pence Sterling; NB(?). The first duty of 241 days cannot be found and which is included in the above sum. Exd Jas. Mc.; Note: NB The 241 days since found in Capt. James Bridges Pay Bill on which interest is to be allowed. Exd. Jas. Mc

**The State of South Carolina to William Brannon:**

To 241 days duty as Horseman from the 7th of June 1780 to the 7th of April 1781 both days included in Pay Bill of Capt. Major Parson cert. pay Capt. James Bridges Company - L241;  
To 84 days duty as do[ditto] from the 7TH of June 1780 to the 1 July 1781 both days included for pay bill of do[ditto] -- 84;  
To 171 days duty as Horseman from 25 March 1779 to 15th Sept 1779 pay bill of Capt. Hambleton. Cert. Pay Col. John Thomas-----  
L496/L70.17.10 Sterling;  
In the above being foot instead of horseman duty, therefore is only half the 171 days -- of L85.10. 25 Feb 1786

Know all men present that I **William Brannon** for divers good causes considerations have made ordained authorised & appointed & by these presents do make ordain authorise & appoint Gabriel Moffitt my true & lawful attorney for me & my name to ask & receive of the publick treasurers of South Carolina all the indents due to me with the lawful for trust due thereon & do these by authorise my attorney to pay to Treasurers the publick fees for any lands as he shall think proper or to dispose of them as any other way I also improve my said attorney to act in that case as he shall think proper & to assign the above premises as fully as if I myself ever personally present by virtue of these presents as witness my hand this 28 day of August, 1785. South Carolina -- Pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly passed the 16th of March 1783, We the Commissioners of the Treasury, have this Day delivered to **Mr. William Brannon** this our Indented Certificate for the Sum of Fifty-Eight pounds twelve shillings, and ten pence Sterling, duty as a Horseman in Capt. Parsons and Hamilton's Companies, of Col. Roebucks Regiment pay account passed by the Commissioners.....the said William Brannon, his Executors, Administrators, or assigns, will be entitled to receive from this Office the Sum of Four pounds two shillings and a peny on the demand for one year's interest on the principal sum of Fifty-Eight pounds twelve shillings, and ten pence Sterling and the like interest annually.

The said **William Brannon** his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, will be entitled also to receive, and

shall be paid, if demanded, the principal sum of Fifty eight pounds 12 shillings and ten pence on the ninth January 1789 and the said William Brannon his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, may make any purchases at any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered by the Legislature for Special Purpose) and this INDENT shall be received in Payment.

For the Performance of the several Payments in Manner abovementioned, the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of the STATE pledged by the aforesaid ACT.

GIVEN under our hands at the TREASURY OFFICE in CHARLESTON, the ninth day of January One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Seven. L58.12.10 principal; L4.2.1 annual interest. File No. 80, Book Z

I do certify Will. Branham enlisted for the War in Col. Baylor's Dragoons 1778 & has faithfully served the term of his enlistment. /s/ Will Barret, Capt., Baylor's Dragoons

Know all men by these presents that \_\_\_ **William Branham**, soldier, belonging to the third Regt. Light Dragoons commanded by Col. George Baylor for \_\_\_ good causes by these presents do make constitute and appoint my true friend Benjamin Hawkins my attorney and lawful allowing for me and in my name to and receive a payment of Virginia my wages due to me for the services I have done in the Continental Army. Prize money or land warrants and all other things whatsoever that be due to me for my services given and granting to my said attorney full power to take such legal methods to receive such sum or sums of money as myself -- might or could do \_\_\_\_\_ especially \_\_\_\_\_ hereby \_\_\_\_\_ and confirm all that my said attorney or cause to be done \_\_\_\_\_ of premises by virtue of these presents.
