

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN de CANCEFIELD

Generation 1

John de Cancefield; marr. Unk; ISSUE: 1. **Sir Richard Cancefield**

Note: In 1276 **Geoffrey de Nevill** and **Margaret** his wife claimed from Roger Lestrangle the custody of John son and heir of **Richard** (son of **John**) **de Cansfield**. It was stated that **John** the grandfather of the heir had held 1½ oxgangs of land in Wennington of **Henry** father of **Roger de Croft** by knight's service and that **Roger's** tenement was then in plaintiffs' custody, **Roger** being a minor. Defendant alleged that the ancestors of **Cansfield** had been enfeoffed by the ancestors of **Roger** son and heir of **Roger de Mowbray**, a minor [De Banco R. 14, m. 70, 71]. ~VCH: *The History of Lancaster, Vol. VII*, pp. , footnote

Sir Richard Cancefield, Lord of Cancefield & Lancaster; marr. Alienor/**Alice le Fleming**, Lady of Aldingham (See [Fleming Family](#)); ISSUE: 1. Agnes

Generation 3

Agnes de Cancefield, Lady of Aldingham, b. ca. 1264 Aldingham & d. ca. 1293 in Adlington, Cheshire, Eng. (dau. Sir Richard Cansfield, Lord of Cancefield & Lancaster & Alice le Fleming, Lady of Aldingham;
marr. Robert de Harrington, Cumberland (See [Harrington Family](#)); Issue: 1. Wm 2. Sir Richard 3. **John**.

p. 151-52 The first Fleming appearing in records was **Michael le Fleming, Knight**. He resided commonly at Beckermeth, where was a castle anciently called "Caernarvon Castle" He was also lord of the manors of Aldingham & Gleston in Furness in the county of Lancaster. He later received the name of Michael de Furness. He married unknown & had issue: 1. William 2. **Richard** 3. Daniel 4. Anselm 5. Jordan 6. Godith. The son, William had son William le Fleming of Furness, Knight who had son Sir Michael le Fleming of Furness, Knight who was drowned & died without issue. Thus, his sister & heir marr. **Richard de Cancefield** - Son of Agnes & Robert de Harrington was John de Harrington who in 34 Ed. I was knighted; & having been summoned to parliament as a baron from the 18 Ed. 2 to the 21 Ed 3 he died in that year.
