Page 3: Confederate States to **B. J. Cox** To services rendered as surgeon in Battalion from the 14th July to 1st June 1863 at \$80.00 per month = \$280.00

Camp Bowen, June 1863, I do certify.....that **Doctor B. J. Cox** was employed by me as Surgeon of both KY MT Rifles and dated as such from the 14th day of July 1863 to 1st June 1863 that his service was necessary to the public service; there being some sickness in Camp and no other surgeon in the Battalion. Said act(?) is just & the price charged is reasonable. /s/ A. H. Keay(?)_____

Received at Saltville(VA??)this 3rd day of June 1863 of June 1863 of Maj. J. B. Harrie(?) two hundred and eighty dollars in full of the above amount. /s/ **B. J. Cox**
