Generation 1

Robert de Harington; of Harington, Cumberland, Eng.; marr. Unk; ISSUE: 1. **Thomas**

Generation 3

Michael de Harington of Harington, Cumberland, Eng.; marr. Unk;

Issue: 1. Robert de Harington

Note: According to Carl Boyer in his book, *Medieval Ancestors of Robert Abell*, the pedigree that begins with Osulf of Flemingby to Sir Robert de Harington is taken from Ian Grimble's *The Harington Family*. Grimble says the Plea Roll of 1277 contains a pedigree of Sir Robert's descent from Osulf which confirmed the evidence of the Register at St. Bee's [Dungdale's Monasticon]. This evidence was part of a suit against the Abbot of Holm Culton concerning Sir Robert's claim to the manor of Flemingby, but Robert had to vacate all but 380 acres of the manor.

Generation 4

Robert de Harington; b. bef. 1262, Flemingby, Eng.; d. 1297 Adlingham, Lancashire, Eng.; marr. **Agnes de Cancefield**, Lady of Aldingham, b. ca. 1264 Aldingham & d. ca. 1293 in Adlington, Cheshire, Eng. (dau. Sir Richard Cansfield, Lord of Cancefield & Lancaster & Alice le Fleming, Lady of Aldingham); ISSUE: 1. **Sir John de Harington**, Knight. 2. Michael 3. Elizabeth

Note: The first Harington appears to have owned lands in Lancashire was Robert de Harington, or Haryngton, of Harrington, who in the latter half of the thirteenth century married Agnes, daughter of Sir. Richard Cancefield, lord of Cancefield, or Cantsfield with Farlton, in the parish of Tunstall, in Lonsdale Hundred, by his wife Alice, or Alina, daughter of William le Fleming, lord of Aldingham, an ancient Saxon manor in furness, on the western shore of Morecambe Bay, and who in 1273 acquired the lordship of Aldingham, which had come into his hands in right of his wife after the deaths of her two brothers, John and William Cancefield, both of whom died in their minority, and while in the ward of abbot of Furness. Generation 5

Sir John de Harington, Knight; b. ca. 1281, Aldingham, Lancashire, Eng.; d. July 2, 1347 & bur. in Cartmel Church, Lancashire, Eng.; marr. 1) Julia de Burlingham; 2) **Joan Darce**; ISSUE:

1. Sir John de Harington

Note: *Lancs. Final Conc.* (Record Society of Lancashire and Cheshire), vol.ii, **Joan** probably was a **Dacre**. Her husband's guardian had been a Dacre, and the **Dacre arms were on the Harington tomb**. There is a drawing of the tomb made in 1646 by Daniel King in Dodsworth's MSS, lxxxviii, fo. 20, and from the character of the armour, it is probable that he and his wife are represented by the figures on the Harington. Generation 6

John de Harington, marr. **Katherine Banastre** (dau. of **Adam Banastre & Magaret de Holand**); See [Banastre Family](#) ; ISSUE: 1. Sir Nicholas Harington

Notes:

a) ca. 1329 Margaret (de Holand) Banastre her manors of Aighton, Bolton-le-Moors, Chorley & other lands were divided between her 4 heiress daughters. Partial interests in those estates were held by the Sherburnes & Haringtons for several generations.

b) Sir Nicholas Harington held a 1/4 ownership in the Sherburne manor of Aighton making him the feudal lord of the Bayleys and Sherburnes who held that estate.
