

AMERICAN REVOLUTION WAR (Revised July 2, 2012)

ADAMS, JOHN

American Revolutionary War Service: Halifax Co., VA as Private in the 1st Regiment commanded by Capt. Wm. Cunningham and Col. Richard Parker. ["1st VA Rgmt. by Foot 1775-1783 by M. L. Minnie: **Adams, John, Private** - This soldier enlisted on 14 Feb 1778 for one year in Cunningham's (Markam's) Company joining at Valley Forge in April. Inoculation for small pox was followed by sick in the hospital in May and sick at Valley Forge in June and July. The company was rejoined in August and September was his last report. The 1788 tax list for Chesterfield Co. listed a John Adams."]

ALLISON, WILLIAM

American Revolutionary War, Patriotic Service as follows: Surveyor Overseer & Juror in Wilkes Co., NC; Paid for services rendered [NC Rev. War Pay Vouchers, #4393, Roll #S115.65; Wilkes Co., NC Court mins., 1778-1797, Vol. 1, pgs. 34 and 36.

ANDERSON, JACOB

American Revolutionary War Militia Soldier under Capts. Enock Osborn and Daniel Howe, Montgomery Co., VA.

BERRYMAN, MAXIMILIAN, American Revolutionary War Public Service of Furnishing Supplies, Fauquier Co., VA Court Records, Pgs. 57-8; Library of Virginia, VA PUBLIC CLAIMS CERTIFICATE No. 60 wherein John Blackwell, Commissioner of Fauquier Co., certified that he received of Maximilian Berryman two _____ weighing eight hundred pounds for which payment at the rate of one pound four shilling sterling shall be made according to an act of Assembly passed in the October session 1780. Given under his hand June 9, 1780. /s/John Blackwell

BOYD, GEORGE, American Revolutionary War Service -- He is listed as a Colonel for the VA Militia in "History of Regiments of Virginia in the Revolution", page 84, by Gwathmey.

BRANNON, WILLIAM, American Revolutionary War Service -- He served a total of 496 days both as foot soldier for MD Militia from 25 March 1779 to 15th Sep 1779 under Capt. Hambleton and Col. John Thomas; and as a horseman from 7th of June 1780 to the 7th of April 1781 with Capt. Major Parson and Capt. James Bridges Company under Col. Roebuck and Col. Andrew Pickens. Therefore, Wm. Brannon would have been amongst the mounted state troops, militia and volunteers that joined with Col. Wm. Washington's 3rd Dragoons in the Battle of Cowpens and had a significant role in helping to defeat Tarleton's Army. This was a major turning point in the war and led to a victory for the Patriot's by Gen. George Washington. William Brannon resided in Spartanburg, South Carolina. Revolutionary War Records on ancestry.com show that he was born in VA. It is also believed that he served in Washington's 3rd Light Dragoons commanded by Col. George Baylor. [See War Notes](#)

CAMPBELL, ROBERT

Revolutionary War, Henniker, Hillsborough, New Hampshire. Robert enlisted August 6, 1778 and discharged Aug 27th in order to thwart a looming threat of a large enemy fleet that appeared off the coast of Rhode Island. Records show he served in Capt. Jonas Bowman's Company in Col. Moses Kelley's Regiment of Volunteers who marched from the State of New Hampshire and joined the Continental Army Aug 1778 to Rhode Island. There was an allowance for 21 horses and 2 extra days added for travel home after discharge.

In State and Provincial Papers of NH, Vol. 12, pg 192 Campell/Campbell, Robert appears on Roll of Capt. Aaron Adam's Co., 1776. [Note: Of Maj. Chandler, Sr. That more than half his men had no arms. Out of 60 training soldiers, only 10 went into the army at this date.] Also, Vol. 17, pg. 306 Capt. Robert

Campbell appears on the Roll of Col. Moses Hazen's Regiment, dated Sept. 8, 1772. However, Capt. Robert Campbell is noted as on furlough. Col. Hazen's regiments were known to be a mixture of men from Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Canada, New Hampshire, etc. But no town or county is given for either of the last two citations for Robert Campbell. The war records also indicate Robert's brothers, David, Jesse, John and Annas also served in the war.

COVEY, MATTHEW - Caroline Co., MD 1778 Oath of Fidelity (DAR Verified Patriot) - This is the father of William Covey, shown below.

COVEY, WILLIAM (Verified DAR Patriot)

American Revolutionary War Service - Maryland, Upper Battalion, 4th Reg't

Recruited July 16, 1781 in Dorchester County

Born 1748(c); Died Feb. 14, 1839; Resided MD/NC/TN

Maryland Archives XLVIII (Journals etc.); and XVIII (Muster Rolls, Records & Service of Maryland Troops)

COX, MATTHEW - Matthew Cox, Jr., American Revolutionary War Service - appears in the Militia of Montgomery Co., VA 1777-1790 under Captain Jonathan Isom. [.See other military service notes.](#)

DILLARD, JAMES, Sr. - DAR records show his State of Virginia Patriotic Service based upon supplying of beef (Abercrombie & Slatten, VA Rev. Pub. Claims, Vol. 1, Pg. 74).

FLETCHER, WILLIAM

Sgt. William Fletcher enrolled May 5, 1777 in the American Revolutionary War. He appears on the Roll of Major John Baptista Ashe's Company of the 1st North Carolina Battalion commanded by Colonel Thomas Clark.

HASH, "OLD" JOHN

American Revolutionary War Militia Soldier under Capt. Enoch Osburn Co., Montgomery Co., VA. He also took the Oath of Allegiance in 1777.

MOSELEY, BENJAMIN - DAR records shows his State of Georgia Patriotic Service based upon signing of 1777 Petition. He was issued land per Act of 1781.

PIERCE, THOMAS

American Revolutionary War Soldier under Capt. William Piatt, and Col. Odgen, 1st Regiment, New Jersey. [See Pension notes.](#)

PIERCEALL, RICHARD

American Revolutionary War Service - St. Mary's Co., Maryland; 1776-77 5th Independent; 1778 Upper Battalion (Capt. Jordan) Have copy of pension record. During an interview at age 89, Richard indicated that he was born in 1744; enlisted at Leonardtown in St. Mary's Co., MD in 1776 as a Private in the Maryland Line, 5th Independent Company under Capt. John Allen Thomas, 2nd Lt. Davidson, and 1st Lt. John Stewart as well as Col. R. Barnes; then as a Private under Capt. Charles Jordan. He also recalled association with Ensign Henry Niel, and 1st Lt. John Blackstone. His station at Leonardtown was for the purpose of guarding the town, storehouse & warehouses from the British troops. He remained at Leonardtown until he was discharged due to having consumption. Upon recovering, he returned to service for about 1/2 month. Richard died in Green Co., KY after 1840. The 1840 Kentucky U.S. Census shows him still living in Green Co. at age 99! [See Pension](#)

SEAY, REUBEN -- American Revolutionary War Service - Listed in DAR Records as soldier from Amelia Co., VA who served under Capt. Anderson, Cols. Mathis and Richardson. Ancestry.com Revolutionary War Bounty Land Grants lists: Seay, Reuben, VA, Private, 21 Jan 1784, 200 acres. "General information about Reubin Seay from the records of the National Archives, Washington, D. C. He was a soldier of the Virginia State Line during the Revolutionary War and was issued a certificate for pay the 4th of August, 1783 as a soldier of artillery, for L 82:7:4. Said certificate being delivered to Mr. Banks and was for services prior to the 1st of January, 1782." [See Service Notes](#) also [Seay Pension Notes](#).

STURGILL, FRANCIS,

American Revolutionary War Service -- Listed in DAR Records as soldier from Augusta Co., VA who served in Militia of Montgomery Co., VA under Capt. Enoch Osborne.

TURNER, JOHN: American Revolutionary War Service: Shown on DAR records for patriotic service wherein he rendered material aid (Ref: Abercrombie & Slatten, VA Rev Pub Claims, Vol. 2, pg. 442, Halifax, VA). He died in Dickson Co., TN.

WATERS, MOSES

American Revolutionary Militia Soldier under Capt. Francis Hargrave, Gen. Rutherford, and Col. Benjamin Herndon, North Carolina.

WAR OF 1812

HANING, AARON

Records show that in August 1812, in Athens Co., Ohio, Aaron Haney and other Haney's joined the War of 1812 as volunteers, 2nd Reg't under Capt. Nehemiah Gregory. He was the father of Jabez Haning.

WORLD WAR II

COVEY, WILLIAM

World War II, U. S. Navy, Seaman 1st Class - Served 6/3/44-1/19/46

Ships sailed: USS Chiwaukum AOG #26 & USS Agawam AOG #6z

Medals: WW II Victory; American Campaign; Asiatic Pacific Campaign; Philippine Liberation

Born 7/27/20 in Long Beach, Calif.; Died 1/20/56 in San Francisco, Calif.; Have copy of discharge/military service record.
