

## DESCENDANTS OF ROBERT DE RYE (arms- gules, on a bend argent three rye-stalks sable)

### Generation 1

**Robert de Rye**, marr. Unk; ISSUE:

1. Ranulph 2. Robert 3. John 4. Phillip

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 838, Robert de Rye, Lord of Brignall, Yorkshire and Gosberkirk, Lincolnshire, and held lands in Eveden and Kirkby Laythrope, Lincolnshire. He lived during the reign of Henry II, King of England. He was 3rd in descent from Hubert de Rye, a Norman]

### Generation 2

**Phillip de Rye**; d. ca. 1221; marr. **Kimia** (she claimed her dowry of Hugh, Bishop of Lincoln in 1222; living in 1251); ISSUE: 1. Sir Nicholas de Rye, Knight

Note:

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 839, **Phillip, Lord of Gosberkirk**, held two knights' fees there by arrangement with King John (Pipe Roll 10 John) & other lands: Testa de Nevill granted the advowsons of Gosberton (Gosberkirk) & Grayingham to Hugh, Bishop of Lincoln;

~*Brief History of the Church & Parish of Gosberkirk - p. 38*: Philip de Rye had granted by charter the church of Gosbertkirke to the Bishop who Nov. 3, 1208, transferred it to Richard de Alteberg as parson; p. 39: Robert de Rye presented Magister Richard Devon who was succeeded one year later.

### Generation 3

**Robert de Rye**; b. bef 1226, Lincolnshire, Eng.; d. ca. 1260, Lincolnshire, Eng.; marr. Unk; ISSUE:

1. Sir Nicholas de Rye, Knight

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 839, (**Robert de Rye**) son and heir of Phillip, under age in 1226; held two knights' fee of the Bishop of Lincoln in Gosberton; relinquished half of this to a cousin, Sir John de Rye in 1251.

### Generation 4

**Sir Nicholas de Rye**, Knight; d. bef 1308 & bur. Gosberton Church, Gosberton, Lincolnshire, Eng.; marr. **Johanna Wyhum** (dau & heir of Unk de Wyhum (sued with her husband by the Prior of Ormesby in respect of the pasturage of 260 sheep in No. Cadeby & Wyhum; living in 1289; ISSUE:

1. Sir Edmund de Rye, Knight 2. Thomas

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 839, son & heir & after his father's death: was seised of the manor of Beaurepaire, & presented to the Rectory of Gosberton in 1272; he was sued unsuccessfully for the above property in 1286 by Sir John de Rye, Sheriff of Lincoln; he settled Beaurepaire on his heirs & granted it to Sir William Cressy Knight, as feoffee.

### Generation 5

**Sir Nicholas de Rye**, Knight; marr. **Margaret**; ISSUE: 1. Sir Edmund de Rye, Knight

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 840 - Sir Nicholas was brother & heir who with his wife enfeoffed of the manor of Beaurepaire by Sir. Wm. Cressy, his father's feoffee...bur. in Gosberton Church where there is a monument to his memory.

### Generation 6

**Edmund de Rye**, Knight; d. bef. 1333 & bur. Gosberton Church, Gosberton, Lincolnshire, Eng.; marr.

**Elizabeth** MNU; ISSUE: 1. Beatrice Rye 2. Nicholas 3. Joan 4. Elizabeth (d. before 1362)

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p. 840 - Sir Edmund de Rye, Knight, son & heir; inherited the manors of Beaurepaire and Wyhum while still underage, before 1308. He was alive in the 1320s, but died before 1333. Buried near his father in Gosberton Church, where there was an inscription to his memory. Wife, Elizabeth in the Subsidy Roll of I Edward III, released the manor of Wyhum from her claim for dowry 1371, having survived her husband & son.

### Generation 7

**Beatrice Rye**; d. bef. Nov 1390, Lincolnshire, Eng. & bur. before Nov. 1390, Gosberton Church, Gosberton, Lincolnshire, Eng.; marr. **William de Wyhum** (by banns in Holy Trinity Church, Lincoln);

(See [Wyhum Family](#)); ISSUE: 1. Katherine, dau. & heir of her mother; marr. Sir Nicholas Hebden, Knight J(son of Sir Richard Hebden, Night; bur. at Howell 1416; Will proved Sep 22,1416.

~*Lincolnshire Pedigrees, Vol. III*, Rye Pedigree, p.840 - Beatrice was sister & coheir of brother, Nicholas & her sister, Joan; held half the manor of Beaurepaire; Wm. de Wyhum's Will dated Nov. 1390, was proved at Sleaford, Feb 28, 1390-91.
