NOTE: It is likely that Roger Tempest was of Norman origin.;

1120/21 - Roger Tempest wit. charter founding by Cecilia deRumelli & Wm. deMeschines, her husband, of the Augustinian Priory of St. Mary & St. Cuthbert at Emsay near Skipton in Craven [Dodsw: MSS, Vol. 118, fol. 145d]

1140/41 (ca.) Roger Tempest wit. with **son, Adam**, et al: the grant of Cecilia de Rumelli to Canons of Emsay of vill & mill of Childeuic (or Kildwick) (Monasticon Anglicanum, V. 6, pt. 1; p. 203, #3)

1140/41 (ca.) .) Roger Tempest wit. with **son, Adam**, et al confirmation by Wm. Fitz Duncan (husband of Alice, dau. of Cecilia deRumelli) of grant of vill & mill of Childewic to house of St. Mary & St. Cuthbert of Emsay (Charter penes Edward Hailstone, F.S.A., 1885)

1147-1155 (ca.) Roger Tempest wit. with **son, Adam**, et al grant from Will: Fitz Duncan, nephew of the Scotch king & Alice (de Rumelli), his wife, 250 acs. land in Kilnsey to mons of Fountains; **ALSO:** attested at Skipton, confirmation by Alexander fil Geroldi of grant. [Fountains Abbey Charter: V. III (MSS 37770), fol. 223, No. 1-2]

1154-5 - Roger Tempest wit. with **son, Adam**, et al, charter of Alice de Rumelli to canons of St. Mary & St. Cuthbert of Emsay, the Manor of Bolton.

1147-1155 Roger Tempest with clergymen, et al attested to charter of Wm. Fitz Duncan & Alice de Rumelli, his wife, gift to Monks of St. Mary & St. Cuthbert of Emsay, the church of All Saints Broctune (Broughton-in-Craven) with all lands & tithes (Dodsw: MSS, V. 144, fol. 3d, & V. 9, fol. 221d)

1154/5 - Roger Tempest & brother, Richard Tempest attested to grant from Alice deRumelli of property to several religious entities of the Catholic Church in Broughton & Kilnsey.

1155 - Roger Tempest attested to charter from Alice de Rumelli to Church of St. Bees, all the land & tithes, etc. in Coupland Co., Cumberland (Register of St. Bee's Priory)

1155 - Roger Tempest & brother, Richard Tempest, et al, attested to Alice de Rumelli grant of land in Broughton-in-Craven to monks, St. Jno of Pontefract (Chartulary of St. Jno of Pontefract/YorkRecSoc)

1156 (ca.) - Roger Tempest son, Richard Tempest, et al wit. grant by Alice deRumelli of land in Appletrewick to Edulfo de Culnesc (Kilnsey) (Dodsw: MSS, V. 83, fol.1)

1166-7 - Roger Tempest held 3 carucates (abt. 300 acs.); 2 bovates (abt. 240 acs.)

1156 (ca.) Richard Tempest, with his **father, Roger**, wit. land grant in Appletrewick by Alice de Rumelli.

1156 (ca.) Richard Tempest attested with Elias de Rilleston, et al the confirmation by Alice de Rumelli's mother Cecilia's gift of Silsden mill to Bolton priory [Dodss: MSS, V.9, fol. 220d]

1174-1178 Richard Tempest with **son, Alan**, & Elias de Rilleston, et al, witnessed confirmation of gift land in Kilnsey to Fountains Abbey by Alexander Gerold. (Fountain's Chart. iij, Add: MSS. 37,770, fol. 232, No.11, [Lancaster's Ed:] vol. 1, p.473)

Generation 3

ROGER TEMPEST, d. by Nov 1220; marr. **Alice** (dau. Elias deRilleston of Rilleston-in- Craven ; ISSUE: 1. **Richard**

Note: The vill of Bracewell was returned in Domesday Survey of year 1086 for 600 acs. in fee granted by William the Conqueror to Roger of Poitu..... said to be that which Roger Tempest was possessed of Bracewell (Hist: of Craven 1812, p. 80)

1166-7 - Roger Tempest held 300 acs. & 240 acs. of land

1168 - Roger Tempest fined in Co. York for unjust disseisin (unjust possession of land??) (Pipe Ro: Soc: vol. 12, p.85, Ro: 14 Henry ij).

1209-10 - Roger Tempest fined for forest trespass co. York

1209-10 (ca.) Roger Tempest, Helia de Rilleston, Wm. de Hebden et al wit. land grant in Thorledbi from Wm de Marton to Canons of Bolton (Dodsw: MSS, Vol. 83, fol.39d)

Generation 4

SIR RICHARD TEMPEST; d. by 1237 (Pipe Roll); marr. Elena (dau. & co-heir of Richard deTang (deLang?) who gave Richard & Elena 720 acs. at Bracewell; ISSUE: 1) **Richard Tempest**; 2) William Tempest

[No date] **Richard fil Rogeri Tempest de Braycewell**, quitclaimed Robert dil [SIC] "de" Hackenhouse, & **William his son** of all services due to his mill of Bracewell on the land they acquired from him in the vill of Stook...(Dodsw: MSS, vol. 155, fol. 164).

1220 (ca.) **Richard Tempest**, et al wit. grant of le Vavasour to le Vavasour property in Elslack (Collect: Gen'l: et Topo: Vol. 6, p.126, Charter No. 3).

1222-3 - **Richard Tempest** (Jr.) confirmed gift of his **mother, Alice**, to Robert de Stiveton in marriage to Agnes.... (Dodsw: MSS, vol. 83, fol. 14).

Sir RICHARD TEMPEST of Bracewell, Knight; d. bef June 1268; marr. UNK; ISSUE:

1221-22 - Abbot of Kirdstall sued **Richard Tempest** who claimed as his ancestors possession of Bracewell Church - whereby Richard later released his claim (Curia Regis, Mich. 5 Henry iij, No.78, m.2), and No. 81, Trinity, 6 Henry iij, m.8]

1237 - **Sir Richard Tempest** fined for default (Pipe Ro: No.8, Yorks, 21 Henry III)

1243-1250 - Sir Richard Tempest.... wit. grant [Percy Charters, Surtees Soc: 117]

1245 - Richard Tempest..... attested to land grant in Broughton (Bro'ton No. 5)

1246 - **Sir Richard Tempest** Knighted by Easter

1247 (Pentecost) Richard Temper witnessed transfer of land in Carleton/Craven

1251 - **Sir Richard Tempest** defended his title to 300 acs. land in Bracewell & stock agst Richard de Tong's ancestral claim but Tempest's right was later acknowledged. (Feet of Fines, Yorks, 31-36, Henry iij, No. 196).

1250 - **Sir Richard Tempest** wit. demise of land in Broughton from prior of St. John of Pontefract (Bro'ton deeds, No. 5)

Generation 6

Sir ROGER TEMPEST of Bracewell & Waddington, Knight, d. bef. June 1288, **Alice** (dau. & co-heir of Walter deWaddington of Waddington, co. York (Dodsw: MSS Pedigrees, vol. 6, fol. 54 and vol. 79, fol. 106); ISSUE: 1. **Richard of Bracewell** 2. Nicholas 3. John **1267-8** - **Sir Roger Tempest** was Chief Lord of Waddington Co., York (Assize Ro: No. 1050, m.61d).

1268 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al attested to land grant to Amabel, widow in Broughton (Deeds No. 5)

1270 - **Sir Roger Tempest** wit. release..... (Dodsw: MSS. Vol. 155, fol. 180d)

1272 - Inquest at Skipton: **Roger Tempest**, 650 acs. and 240 acs.; fee lands of Skipton castle; 300 acs. in Bracewell & Stock; 100 acs. in Kyghley; 100 acs. in Laycock; 100 acs. in Rilleston; 840 acs. in Skipton (Bro'ton deeds, No.1)

1276 - **Roger Tempest** of deanery of Craven gave 40s. towards crusades (Archbp Gifford's Reg. Vol. 109, Surtees Soc. p.284).

1276 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, juror (Assize Roll 1221, 1-6 Edward j, Divers Cos. m.22d)

1277 - **Sir Roger Tempest** was one of 14 esquires sworn to make inquiry...(Chac: Inq: 5 Edward j, #62)

1277 - **Sir Roger Tempest** to bring plea agst. Abbot of Furness re land by his attorney, John Tempest (De Banco Roll, Hilary, 6 Edward j, #22-23, m. 43d, & m.80d)

1277 (ca.) - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al wit. grant to Abbot of Salley...(Dodsw. MSS, Vol.155, fol. 166).

1279 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, John Tempest, Wm Tempest of Midhope attested to deed re land in Bracewell (Lord Ribblesdale's Calton deeds No. 23)

1279 Oct 8 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, with brother John, et al. attested agmt. re mill at Hanlith (Ibid. #24)

1279-80 (8 Edward j) **Sir Roger Tempest**, Juror at Inquest.. (Chanc: Inq. p.m. 8 Edward j, No. 12)

1280 (Michelmas) - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al was surety re suit agst. Abbot of Furness (Assize Roll 1067)

1281 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al wit. confirmation of land transaction in Headingly (Asz. Roll 1517)

1282 - **Sir Roger Tempest** complaint agst. false charges at court (DeBanco Roll, Mich. #49,m.34)

1283 May - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al inquest to prove toft (homestead) in Rimington held of John Parson of Gisburn (Inq. p.m., 11 Edward j. #75)

1283 Oct 28 - **Sir Roger Tempest** at inquest of knights' fees (Cal.Pat.Roll 1281-920)

1285 - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al wit. re gift of land in vill of Browthton (Bro'ton deeds #2)

1286 Mar 26 - **Sir Roger Tempest** wit. at York grant (Dodsw: MSS, Vol. 155, fol. 128)

1287 June - **Sir Roger Tempest**, et al wit. at Fountains confirmation of land grant to Ftms. Abbey (Fountains Chartulary, V.5/f.357, #19)

1287 Oct 8 - **Sir Roger Tempest** held 600 acs & 720 acs of Wm. deFortibus, of Skipton fee (Cal: Inq: Edward j, Vol. 2, p.352, Exch: Accts: Extents No. 1)

1287 Nov 3 - **Sir Roger Tempest** at Broughton wit. release of land in Elslack (Coll: Topo: Gen'l V6/p139)

1287 **Sir Roger Tempest** held 600acs. & 240 acs. of Skipton fee. (Cal: Inq: p.m. Edward I, Vol. 2, p. 352).

1288 June - **Sir Roger Tempest's** name erased from jury panel with "obit" written over it.

1290 Oct - **Sir Roger Tempest's** **Widow, Alice**, sued for her 1/3 interest of lands in Bracewell, Skipton, Waddington, Stokely, & Rilleston (De Banco Roll, 88 Mich: 18 and 19 Edward j, m.163d).

1298 - **Sir Roger Tempest's** **Widow, Alice**, renewed suit for dower out of 3 messuages & 5 bovates of land in "Styveton" agst. Robert de Stiveton & 1 agst. John deKirkeby for... (Ibid. Roll 127, Mich. 26 Edward j, m.89d and Roll 126, Trinity 26 Edward j, m.93)

1298 June - **Widow, Alice**, withdrew writ of dower agst. Wm. de Cantilupe (Ibid Roll 126 Trinity 26 Edward j, m.48)

1300 Easter - Jury found Alice to not be entitled to her claim agst. Styveton... (Ibid. Roll 128 Hil: 27 Edward j, m.90d and Roll 131 Trinity 27 Edward j, m.151)

1301-2 Mar 8 - Alice Tempest died holding of her grandson John Tempest's estates.... (Pipe Roll, 22-33 Edward j Escheators Accounts Ultra Trent: 27-33 Edward j, 3/8 and 30 and 31 years)

1276 **Richard Tempest** sued through his uncle, John Tempest, John de Percy et al for assault on him at Gracewell (De Banco Ro: 17, 4 Edward I, m. 106)

1293 Wm. de Hertlington held of **Richard Tempest**, 100 acs. of land in Rilleston (Chanc. Inq. p.m., 21 Edward I, No. 48)

1297 Sep 29 - **Richard Tempest** had an under age heir (Escheat: Accts Ultra Trent: Ro: 26 de Lythegreynes & Pipe Ro: 30 Edward I).

Generation 8

SIR JOHN TEMPEST, of Bracewell, b. Aug. 24, 1283; d. aft. Jun 25, 1356;); marr. **Isabel** MNU; ISSUE: 1. **Sir John Tempest, Jr.**

Note: 1356 June 25 - John Tempest witnessed a deed in Elslack (next to Broughton [Ref: Papal Indult, June 1344 to **John Tempest, Knight, and Isabel his wife** to select their confessors at the hour of their deaths (*Calendar of Papal Registers, Papal Letters*, v. 3, p. 179)]

1304, Oct - **Sir John Tempest** was in ward to the king & had livery of his lands (Close Ro: 126)

1313 Oct - **John Tempest** with Lord Holand & others pardoned for rebellion agst. Piers Gaveston. (Close Ro: 126, 32 Edward j, m.3).

1322 July - Rebellion revived, pardoned & fined. (Parl: Writs, vol. 2, p.67, #12 & p.206, #51 [216 # 57?])

1324 May 30 - **Sir John Tempest** summoned as Knight of Shire for Yorkshire to Parliament

1316-1324 - John Tempest of Bracewell rec'd capital messuage in Broghton-in-Craven, 3 tofts (homesteads), 1,320 acs., mediety (equal use) of water mill, etc. (Bro'ton No. 16)

1324-25 - **Sir John Tempest** in military service at Gyenne (Parl: Writs, vol. 2, Div. ij, p.692, No.92)

1325 May - **Sir John Tempest** at Portsmouth & co. going to Gascony (Exch: Q.R. Acct. Bks)

1356 June 25 - **Sir John Tempest** & sons John & Richard, Knights, wit. deed at Elslack (Topo/Gen'l)

Generation 9

SIR JOHN TEMPEST of Bracewell, marr. **Katherine Sherburne** (dau. Sir Robert Sherburne of Mitton by wife, Alice, dau. of **Sir John deBlackburne** of Wiswell by **Margaret dau.of Robert de Holand** &

Elizabeth de Samlesbury. ISSUE: 1. **Sir Richard** 2. Peter 3. Margaret, marr. Sir James Radcliffe (Bracewell Sht.44)

1349 July - **Sir John Tempest** witness with father, Sir John at Beamsley [Dodsw. MSS., V.83,f.123].

1350/51 March - re debt to Sir William deClifton from Lady Alice, wife of Sir Robert de Shirburne, Sir John Tempest, the younger (puisne), Robert de Shirburne, (clerk), William Shirburne, Robert_____ & William deClayton, Vicar of Pulton. [Lancashire Rec. Off.]

1352 Pentecost - **Catherine** brought action for novel disseisin fo land in Wood Plumpton (Assize Rolls, Lanc.)

1354 - **Sir John Tempest & wife, Catherine** got Papal Indult to choose their confessors (C. Papal Letters, iii. 527)

1353/4 Jan 6 - By gift of Lady Alice, wife of Robert de Shirburn, knight, to **Sir John Tempest, knight, and Katherine his wife**....said Sir John was given land & all the corn sown on it.... Given at Carlisle, Monday in the feast of the Epiphany of our lord, of the 27th year of the reign of King Edward the third since the conquest...

1353 - **Sir John Tempest & wife, Katherine** agst. John & Isabel de Stafford et al re land in Wode (Wood) Plumpton (Lancashire Assize Roll, No.1,mm. 1&27)

1354 Aug - **Sir John Tempest and Katherine** his wife, in diocese of York, got a Papal Indult to choose their confessors (*Calendar of Papal Registers, Papal Letters*, Vol. 3, p. 527).

1356 June - **Sir John Tempest** wit. at Elslack with father, Sir John, brother Sir Richard (Coll: Topo: et Gen'l, Vol. 6, p. 143)

1362 - **Sir John Tempest** sued his bailiff at Waddington for arrears (DeBanco: Ro: 140, m.163).

1379 - **Sir John Tempest** paid Poll Tax at Waddington (Poll Tax Return, p. 284)

Generation 10

SIR RICHARD TEMPEST, d. by Feb 16 1389/90; marr. **Mary (Maria) Talbot** (dau. of Thomas Talbot) ISSUE: 1) Richard 2) Catherine 3) Nicholas 4) Margaret 5) Robert

Notes: 1) Sir Richard Tempest (Sr.) had an illustrious career involving battles w/Scots & French also with administrative duties in northern Eng. under 5 kings (Edward III-Henry VI). Was co-warde of Berwick Castle w/Sir Thomas Talbot (his wife's brother) in 1385/86;

1359 Mar - **Sir Richard Tempest**, Chivaler, sued Wm. Burgeys of Gargrave for stealing wheat from his granery at Gargrave on Nov 17, 1354 (Goal Delivery York Castle, 24 Edward III, No. 21).

1379 - **Sir Richard Tempest**, Chivaler,paid Poll Tax at Bracewell for self & wife (Poll Tax Returns W.R.Y. (Y.A.S., p.285)

1380 - **Sir Richard Tempest**, Chivaler, sued Thomas Castleford, clerk, for depasturing his corn & grass at Bracewell (DeBanco Ro: Easter, 2 Richard II, m. 364)

1382 Aug - (6 Richard II), John Tempest, son & heir of Sir Richard Tempest of Stodeley (Studley), Knight, granted to **Sir Richard Tempest**, Chivaler, son of **Sir Richard Tempest** of Bracewell, Knights, all land in Pathorne that John inherited from his father, & by Sep 30,1382 deed at Bolton (by Bolland), the same John released to **Sir Richard Tempest**, Knight, all lands in Pathorne inherited from his father..... (Richard Gascoigne's Abstracts of Gascoigne deeds ca. 1575 at Parlinton Hall)

1384, April **Sir Richard Tempest**, Knight, wit. land grant in Stretton near Skipton from John de Malham of Calton (Lord Ribblesdale's MSS. Skipton deeds, No.1)

1384, July **Sir Richard Tempest**, Knight, wit. at Midhope feoffment by Richard le Lydster de Derby & Catherine,his wife, of their land in Midhope (Dodsw: MSS, Vol. 155, fol.174)

1385 Apr 26 - **Sir Richard Tempest** on Commission of Array for the W.R. Yorks, re expected invasion of French (Cal: Pat: Ro: 1381-85, p. 590).

1387, Oct, **Sir Richard Tempest**, Knight, sued Nicholas de Horton et al for property damage at Pathenhall (Painley)(De Banco Ro: Micahelmas, 11 Richard II, m.636)

1389-90 - Maria, widow of **Sir Richard Tempest**, released to son her dower in Pathorne & Thornton (Hopkinson MSS. Vol. 1, Fol. 85d)

Generation 11

SIR RICHARD TEMPEST, of Bracewell, Waddington & Broughton-in-Craven [Scrope & Grosvenor Roll (Nicholas), Vol. 1, p.198] ; b. Oct 1356; d. aft Aug 26, 1427; marr. **Margaret Stainforth** (daughter of Robert de Stainforth per Will dated April 1390) ISSUE:

1) **Sir Piers** 2) Robert 3) John 4) Richard 5) Roger 6) Isabel

1371 - Sir Richard Tempest began his military career fighting in Gascony under John Lord Nevile, Lt. of Aquitaine at the relief of Wm. de Montenay at Caen (Sep. 1377)

1380-81 - Sir Richard Tempest, Chivaler, with Sir Gerard Salvin served under Sir Thomas de Felton in Aquitaine with 25 archers & 23 men at arms (Exch: Q.R. Memo: Writs to Barons, Trinity, 8)

1384 Oct - Sir Richard Tempest & Sir Matthew Redmayne..... were Commissioners to inquire on devastations done by Scots at Berwick, Roxburgh Castle & Newcastle on Tyne (Rot: Scot: V.2/68-69)

1384-85 Feb 28 - Sir Richard Tempest & Sir Thos. Swynburne, Knights, agreed with king to be wardens of Roxburgh Castle for 1 year from Apr 2, 1385, rec'd 4300 marks for same (Exch: Q.R. Miscel: Army...)

1385 Sir Richard Tempest fought in Scotland under Earl of Lancaster & was with king's expedition to that country

1385 June - Sir Richard Tempest sued by Exchequer for money rec'd serving in Aquitaine in 1381, but he was pardoned of all balance (Exch: Q.R. Memo: Writs to Barons...).

1385 Aug - Sir Richard Tempest by indenture at Newcastle-on-Tyne, with Sir Thos. Swynburne, Chivalers, wardens of Roxburgh Castle, agree to attend the king for 29 days....with 40 men at arms & 80 archers beyond their garrison (Exch. T. R. Miscell: 46/1)

1385/87 Mar 9 - by indenture Sir Richard Tempest & Sir Thos. Talbot, Chivalers, were appointed wardens of Berick-on-Tweed from April 18, 1386 to May26,1387 & to receive 7000pds to keep a garrison of 495 men, all who but a few were to be men of Craven or So. Richmondshire. **Sir Richard Tempest** sealed the agmt. with his armorial coat (bend between 6 martlets, crest being on a cap of maint. a bird bet. 6 martlets, the crest being on cap of maint. a bird statant. (Exch: K.R. Accts. Bdle 73/2, #34)

1386 - Due to truce made with Scots on June 27 1386, **Sir Richard Tempest & Talbot** agreed April 18, 1386 to keep 270 men only (Foreign Accts, 12 Richard ij, (G) #5)

1385/86 April: While **Sir Richard Tempest** was warden of Roxburgh Castle, the **Scots abducted his papers & his wife** between April 1385 & April 1386. [Ref: "Exch: Q.R. Memorand: Mich: 1 Hen IV Writs to Barons m. 9."] **Note:** Hostage likely returned by April 1386 as she appears in 1390/91 Stainforth Will.

1387 June 6 - Sir Richard Tempest, Knight, beloved knight of king was granted licence to fight a Scotch knight who challenged him (Rot: Scot: Vol. 2, p. 90)

1388 - Sir Richard Tempest headed list of retinue of Earl of Northumberland for government of Carlisle & West Marches (Cotton Charters No. 3)

1389 June - Sir Richard Tempest & Sir Thos. Talbot by writ the Treasury made acct. to them as wardens for Berwick-on-Tweed [Foreign Accts, No. 5, 12 Richard ij (g)]

1389 Aug - Sir Richard Tempest re knights fee of Skipton, Bracewell, Stock, Rilleston, & Keighley j (Inq: p.m. Roger de Clifford, 13 Richard ij, #4, m.21)

1390/91 Mar 16 - Will of Robert de Stainforth heirs: daus. **Margaret & Agnes**; sons & daus. of **Richard Tempest** (Knight); Abbot of Sallay; [Ref: York Registry of Wills, Borthwick Institute of Univ. of York, Vol. 1, ff. 56 & 25.]

1390 May 16 - Sir Richard Tempest co-exor. & residuary legatee of Robt.de Stainforth (Re:Test:Ebor)

1394 Apr 1 - Sir Richard Tempest by indenture at Berwick agreed with Henry de Percy, Earl of Northumberland to be his lieutenant of Berwick for 1 year, with garrison (Wolley Chart. V. 7)

1401 - Sir Richard Tempest was one of knights of shire for Lancashire (Proc: Priv: Coun: V1/164)

1403-4 - Sir Richard Tempest petitioned Parliament for repayment of wages to soldiers when he was Lieutenant of Castle of Carlisle in 1396....(Rot: Parl: vol. 3, p. 542)

1403-4 - Sir Richard Tempest was Knight of Shire for Yorkshire (Blue Bk M.P's, V. 1/266).

1406 Oct - Sir Richard Tempest granted by king 20pds a year for life out of town of Preston-in- Craven, annual rent granted him by Earl of Northumberland included (Exch: Q.R. Memo: Writs to Barons...)

1419 Sep 12- demise by Robert Tempest of Stayneforth to Wm Finch et al of manors and lands, "late held by Thos. de Scheffeld of Braythwell," there is no mention of these properties having been owned by the Stainforths [Ref: *Yorkshire Archaeological Journal*, v. 12, p. 114],

Generation 12

1412 June 13 - witnesses to a deed: **Piers Tempest** , (Piers' father) Sir Richard Tempest, John Tempest, Lawrence Hamerton, et al (Dodsw. MSS, vol. 83, fol. 51 deed).

1414 Nov 8 - at Elslack, **Piers Tempest** wit. deed with Sir Richard Tempest, et al (Collect: Topograph: et Geneal: vol. 6, p.310, copy of deed).

1415 Oct 24 - Piers Tempest fought under Henry V and was knighted by the king on the eve of the battle of Agincourt, near the bridge of St Moxence as being one of the king's "hardy and valliant gentlemen" (Nicolas's Hist: of the battle of Agincourt (2 Edward) p.102 note)

1417 June 11 - "**Petrus Tempest, Chivaler**" heads the list of 50 men at arms with Lord de Clifford, the Lord of Skipton who mustered with 149 archers on Techebourne (5 Henry v) (Exch: Q.R. army 61/10 and Exch: T.R.. Misc: 43/9 and Agincourt Ro: Accts Exch: Q. R. 51/2 m.21).

NOTE: Sir Piers probably died with the Army in France, as no further evidence of him has been found after June 1417 (E.B.T.). He was dead before 1421, when his wife Grace had remarried to Sir William Fraunk, Knight (Imq: p.m. 11 Henry vj, No. 2).

In the pedigree of Tempest of Bracewell, given as entered in Tonges's Visitation of the north, 1530, it is stated that "Syr Pyers, younger son of Sir Richard Tempest married the daughter and heir of Syr Nycholas de Rye" etc. (Surtees Soc: vol. 41, p.84), this statement being repeated in Flowers Visitation of Yorks 1563 and Glovers 1585 (Harl. Soc: vol. 16, P. 314 and North Visitation: Coll of Arms, 2 D 5, fol. 185). To prove this statement is not correct, in 1516, John Tempest, as son and heir of Piers, son and heir of Sir Richard Tempest, was found to be heir to the said Sir Richard (Common Plea: Ro: Trin: 7 Henry viij, m.314). The last Sir Nicholas de Rye died "sine prole" the 11 September 1363, seized of two manors in Wyhum, the manor of Bealraper in Gosberkirke (modern Gosberton) and lands in Pinchbeck, Quadrington, Donyngton etc. co.
