ISSUE: 1. Henry

1) by deed (undated) in the Machel MSS. at Carlisle consisting of a grant of lands at Ormeshead by Robert son of Robert son of Gamel de Sandford to **Richard de Warthecopp**

2) **Richard de Warthecopp** was one of the commissioners appointed on the death of Robert de Veteripont, Lord of Westmorland, in 49 Henry III (1263), and who was still living in 20 Edward I when he was a juror in a case at Appleby between the King and the Abbey of St. Mary at York, but was dead in 8 Edward II when his **son Henry held the manor of Warthecop**. 1301 Dec 9 - (Linlithgow) Pardon to Richard son of Robert de Askeby, **John son of William de Warthecopp**, **William son of William de Warthecopp** and **Thomas son of William de Warthecopp**, by reason of their service in Scotland, for rescuing **Richard son of William de Warthecopp** when indicted of the death of John Baron, so that he could not be taken by the men of the town of Warthecopp following him. **1268** (pre) Gervase de Lanton to Thos. Musgrave gift of land in Soulby; named: **Wm. de Warcop**, Robt. de Strickland, Knight, Thomas de Hellebeck, Wm. de Dacre, et al

**1280-1290** (circa) Robt. de Sandford (son of Wm.) to Thos. de Musgrave gift of land in Soulby, Hayburg, Wintonstey, Quertongate, Hyingeslac, Struthwyth; named: Thos. de Hellebec, **Wm. de Warcop**, et al

**1324/5** March 20 - Richard Musgrave bond to Robt. de Musgrave; named: **Henry de Warcop**, et al

**1333** May 19 - Richard de Musgrave son of Nicholas to Lady Matilda de Bedale...gift of lands & water mill in Soulby; named: **Henry de Warcop**, Robert de Sanford, Sheriff of Westmorland, et al

**1336** January - Richard de Musgrave gift to Henry de Wharton land in Soulby; field names: **Henry de Warcop** et al

**1336** Sep 15 - **William L'Engleys** of Askeby to Henry (son of Gilbert de Wharton) land next to Soulby Mill; named: **Henry de Warcop**, et al

**1337** January 20 - Henry de Wharton to Richard de Musgrave gift of land in Soulby next to mill in exchange for another piece of land in Soulby; named: **Henry de Warcop** et al

**1339** Nov 14 - Richard de Musgrave to Emma, widow of Robt. de Musgrave grant of land in Soulby; named: **Henry de Warcop**, et al

**1355** Sep 23 - Robt. de Woulselay & Wm. Beuchamp gift of land in Soulby to Sir Thos. de Musgrave; named: **Thomas de Warcop**, **Thomas L'Engleys**, Knight, et al.

ca. post **1380** - Gervase son of Jno. de Levington to Jno, son of Thos. de Musgrave gift of land in Soulby; named: Thomas de Hellebeck, Knight, Henry de Staneley, **Wm. de Warcop**, Robt. de Sandford, et al

ca. post **1380** - Gervase son of Jno. de Langton to Thos. son of Thos. de Musgrave, land in Soulby; named: **William de Warcop**, Robt. de Sandford, Henry de Stanelay, et al

Mandate to absolve from the sentence of excommunication incurred, imposing a salutary penance & afterwards to dispense (first separating them for a time) to contract marriage anew, declaring their past & future offspring legitimate, **Thomas Warcop**, of Lambertfet donsel, & Margaret Plumland, damsel, who married knowing that Margaret & John de Smerdal, Thomas's first wife, were related in the 3rd degree of kindred, & therefore Thomas & Margaret in the 3rd degree of affinity. The survivor is to remain unmarried
