1684 March 5 - Richard Wood, Planter, 200 ac. from Wm. Loyd [ORK Deed Bk 7, pg 165-67] Recorded May 12, 1685.

1688 Aug 1 - Richard Wood, Planter, 50 acs. from Col. Wm. Loyd [ORK Deed Bk 7, pg 430-31] Recorded Sep 16, 1688

1693 May 3 - Richard Wood of Richmond Co. [also by Power of Atty. from wife, **Mary Wood**] to Thomas Reily 200ac in presence of George & Alexander Henson

1724 Feb 2 - John & Mary Murphey (Mary, Widow of Richard Wood) to Edward Hinkley 250 acres 1/2 mi. back of main run of Rappahannock Ck[NFP Antient Press, Richmond Co., VA DB8, pg. 269]

1728/29 Mar 13 - Richard Wood, 600 ac. above Goose Creek on head draughts of Limestone Branch falling into Limestone Run, Stafford Co., VA [LVA online No. Neck Grants B, pg. 216]

1731 Sep 1 - Richard Wood, 1,238 ac. adjoining land of Wm. Hawlin above Goose Creek below Yellow Rocks, Prince Wm. Co., VA

1732 March 19 - Richard Wood (wife, Martha) relinquished her dower) Planter of Truro Parish to **Richard Wood, Jr.**, 200 ac above Goose Ck. [Prince Wm. Co., VA Vol. B, pgs 83-86]

1733 Dec 26 - Richard Wood, Planter of Prince Wm. Co. from Geo. Sleater 100 acres near Clarks Run . [Prince Wm. Co., VA Vol. B, pgs 422-425]

1734 March 6 - Richard Wood, Planter of Prince Wm. to John Mercer of Stafford Co., 1,238 acres. . [Prince Wm. Co., VA Vol. B, pgs 271-275]

1734 March 19 - Richard Wood, Planter of Prince Wm. to Richard Roberts 100 ac. near Clarks Run. . [Prince Wm. Co., VA Vol. B, pgs 83-86]

1739 May 8 - Richard Wood, Planter of Truro Parish to Thomas Johns, Cecil Co., MD 200 ac. . [Prince Wm. Co., VA Vol. B, pgs 278-282]

1747 Aug 20, Richard Wood, 200 ac. no. side Teag Creek, Brunswick Co., VA [LVA, Pat. Bk 28, p. 195]
1762, May 24, Charles Humphries to Thomas Cadet Young, 200 acres, north side of Tequa Creek adjoining land of Wood and Harrison, formerly granted by Letters of Patent to Richard Wood on August 20, 1747 and by his Last Will and Testament granted to **his daughter, Susannah Wood** who later conveyed it to Charles [Note: David Ally Burton sic for Halliburton is incorrectly dubbed husband of Susanah. But he was actually the husband of Amy Humphries the other heir of Richard Wood] Brunswick Co., Deed Book 7, Pages 149, 159-161]

Wills and Estates

1746 April 28, Will of Richard Wood (proved Sep 4, 1746)St. Andrew Parish.

To wife Mary – his plantation w/land given her by her 1st husband John Humphries.

To **only daughter Susanna** – 200 ac., Brunswick Co. joining above land.

To wife Mary & daughter Susanna – after debts paid, all his personal estate.....

[Re: court action for trespass against Thomas Lloyd in said Brunswick Co; Richard Wood requests that his executors, if needed, bring action against sd Lloyd in behalf of his daughter **Susanna**; Richard further stated that Lloyd sold him 347 acres on Allens Creek and that any money recovered to be put at interest for his daughter **Susanna** until she comes of age or marry.
